**WHO?** All registered Venturing Leaders and interested parents.

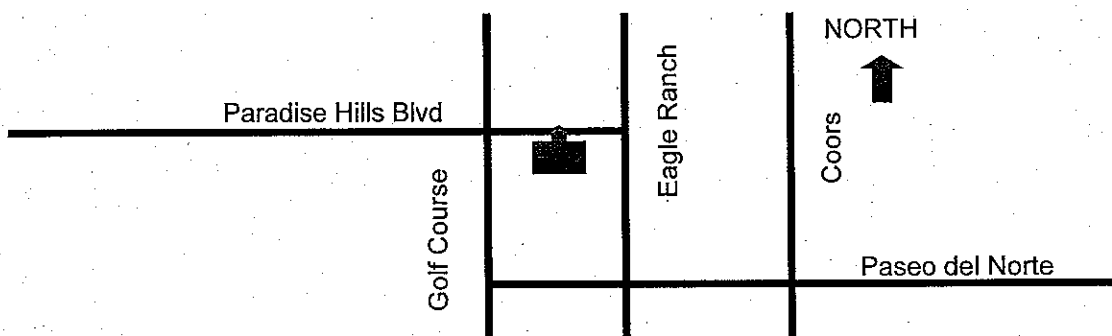

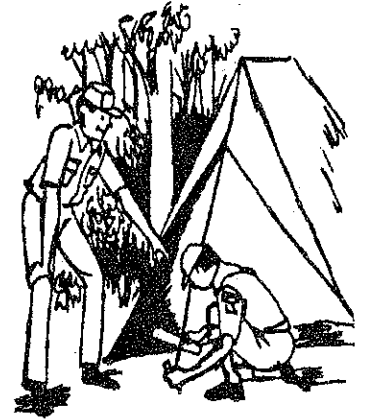

Outdoor skills are critical to the success of the Scouting program, and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills will provide leaders with the basic outdoor skills information needed to start a program right.

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills is the required outdoor training for all Scoutmasters, assistant Scoutmasters, and Varsity Scout coaches. All Webelos Den Leaders, and any leader or parent interested in outdoor skills are encouraged to attend. The skills taught are based on the outdoor skills found in *The Boy Scout Handbook*. The course is also ideal for Venturing leaders because it focuses on skills that build confidence and competence in leaders conducting outdoor camping experiences.

## WHAT TO BRING (Ref: Boy Scout Handbook, Chapter 9)

### PERSONAL OVERNIGHT CAMPING GEAR

- Uniform (not required, but preferred)
- Other weather-appropriate clothing.
- Warm jacket and rain gear.
- Sturdy walking shoes or boots
- Hat or cap/sunscreen
- Boy Scout Handbook
- Ground cloth, pad, and sleeping bag or blankets; pillow optional
- Backpack or Duffel
- Plate, bowl, eating utensils
- Personal 1<sup>st</sup> Aid kit
- Pocketknife
- Flashlight
- Matches/fire-starters (no lighter fluid)
- Compass
- Toilet kit: toothbrush/toothpaste, washcloth/towel, soap, comb, tissue
- Notebook, pen/pencil
- Optional: such as gloves, sunglasses, camera, musical instrument

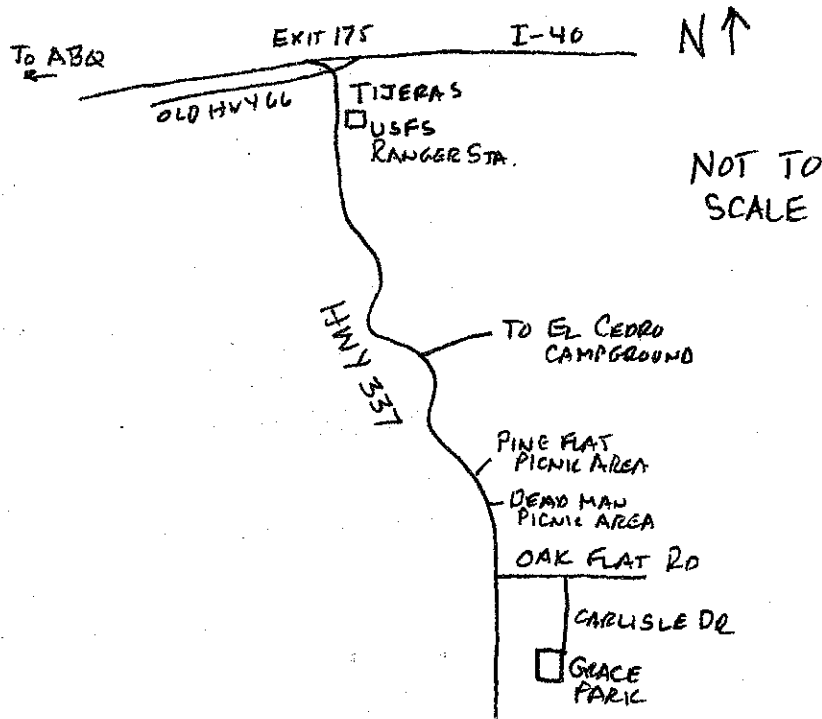
**PATROL/CREW GEAR** (participants are encouraged to "buddy-up" in order to share this kind of equipment. You may bring personal gear or borrow from your troop or other leaders)

- Tent with poles, stakes, lines (two-person style preferred; please avoid "family-size" models).
- Dining Fly/Tarp with poles/stakes
- Extra nylon cord (50' should do)
- Camp Stove and fuel
- Cooking gear as required by menu
- Cleanup items such as dish soap, sanitizing tablets, souring pads, sponge or dishcloth, plastic trash bags, paper towels or toilet paper
- Thread, needle, safety pins, duck tape (for tent & equipment repair)
- Group Extras (optional) such as spices, grill, camp shovel, hot pot tongs, wash basin, camp lantern, small US Flag.

**WATER!** Bring a personal canteen or water bottle and a larger water jug or cooler for the group. **LATRINES?** They're OK!

### DIRECTIONS TO GRACE PARK

Take I-40 to Tijeras. Exit #175 onto Hwy 337. Follow Hwy 337 south approximately 8 ½ miles. At the National Forest Sign (Leaving Cibola National Forest) turn left onto Oak Flat Rd. Go about ½ mile to Carlisle Drive. Turn right and follow to the first gate on the right. You have arrived at Grace Park.

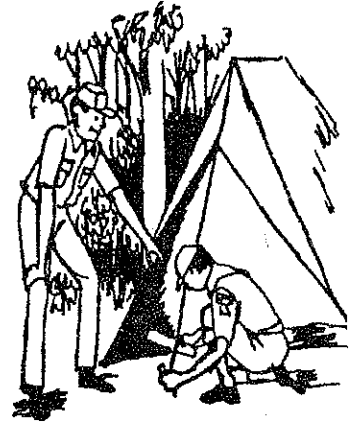
